



Utricularia (Bladderwort) - Care Leaflet

Summer

- > A position on a windowsill, greenhouse or conservatory, full sun or semi shade
- > Rainwater only, sit in water (in a deep saucer)
- > Feeding: we have never found this to be necessary, as the plants only require a few insects per year to survive.

Winter

- > These plants are not hardy, so move indoors or heated greenhouse. There is not sufficient light for the plants, so they will stop flowering and not look their best
- > During this period, the main risk to the plant is rotting caused by fungal diseases, usually a result of overwatering. Reduce watering, keeping the plant damp, but never let them dry out completely.

Rainwater alternatives: distilled, de-ionised, reverse osmosis water

Repotting: research your specific plant for the best time to repot and potting medium. The specialist mixture is available from our on line shop
