

Cephalotus (Australian Pitcher Plant) - Care leaflet

Summer

- > A position on a windowsill, greenhouse or conservatory, full sun
- > Rainwater only, water from the top, let the plant drink the water before rewatering (feel the weight)
- > Feeding: we have never found this to be necessary, as the plants only require a few insects per year to survive.

Winter

- > These plants are not hardy, so move indoors (windowsill, conservatory) or preferably in a greenhouse on a frost stat.
- > The plants have a dormancy period, when they may not look as good as in the summer
- > During this period, the main risk to the plant is rotting caused by fungal diseases, usually a result of overwatering. Reduce watering (water from the top), keeping the plant damp, but never let them dry out completely.

Rainwater alternatives: distilled, de-ionised, reverse osmosis water

Repotting: when the plant is bursting out of its pot, in a specific peat and perlite mixture or specialist peat free mix (both available from our on line shop).
